Recipes from Roc-Day

Some of the dishes served at Roc Day were so delicious, that members asked for recipes.

Sue Weaver's Scalloped Pineapple Recipe:

Beat 3 eggs in a mixing bowl.

Add 1/2 cup sugar and 2tbsp flour.

Mix well, then add one 20oz can crushed pineapple with juice.

Mix well and pour into greased baking dish.

Dice up 3-4 slices of bread and place on top (could use some sort of fancy bread!)

Melt 1/4 cup butter and drizzle over bread.

Bake at 350 degrees for about 1/2 hour.

She doubled the recipe for Rock Day but did not double the topping and baked it for about 1 hour.

Karey Salomon's Black Bean/Chickpea Brownie Recipe:

Melt 1 1/2 c semi-sweet chocolate chips

In a food processor, blend

 $2\ \text{cups}$ cooked chickpeas, drained and rinsed/ this is one can/ you can also use 1 can of black beans

3 eggs / or 1 cup egg substitute

3/4 c sugar

1/2 tsp baking powder

2 tsp instant coffee

1 tsp vanilla or orange extract

Add melted chocolate and blend again

Pour into lightly greased 9" square cake pan

Bake at 350 degrees 45 minutes or until a tester or knife can be poked in and removed clean. Cool, cut into wedges and serve with a raspberry sherbet or sorbet.




