Apricot Fruitcake Recipe from Angelika St. Laurent

Ingredients

1 cup of cut up dried apricots

1 cup of water

1/4 cup tart cherry concentrate

1/4 cup water

1 stick of butter, cut up fine

1 cup sugar

1/2 teaspoons of salt

6 egg yolks

1 cup of oat flour

1/2 teaspoon baking soda

6 egg whites

2 pounds of dried fruit, unsulphured, cut small (apples, cranberries, prunes)

1 cup of raisins

1 cup of pecan nut pieces

1 cup oat flour

Simmer apricots in water until soft, puree. Add water, juice concentrate, butter, sugar, and salt, while apricot puree is still warm. The butter will melt into the rest of the mixture.

Divide eggs. Beat the egg whites until stiff. Then beat the egg yolks with the apricot mix, until fluffy. Lift 1 cup oat flour and baking soda under the mixture. Then lift stiff egg whites under the mix.

Preheat oven to 275F.

Mix fruits and nuts with one cup oat flour.

Butter and flour two bread pans.

Lift fruits under the dough. Fill everything into the bread pans. Put in oven. Bake for 2 hours.








