Roc Day Challenge

When I went out last October and bought 12 pounds of raw Lincoln wool for our Roc Day competition, I was mildly worried about what I would do if I ended up stuck with several pounds of it (admittedly, ending up with several pounds of lovely fleece, isn't really all that much of a worrying prospect to a hand spinner. I just didn't want to get my hopes up, so I stuck with worrying..) Well, even before the December meeting, every single 8-ounce bag had been delivered into eager hands, and I had only my own 8 ounces to play.

On Roc-Day, 17 finished bags were on our table to be admired. Every single one of them fit the criteria of holding a cup of marbles and being made exclusively from the eight ounces of wool provided. The competition really let the guild's creativity shine. There were bags for many different purposes and shapes, ranging from planters and tissue dispensers to bottle carriers to shopping bags with little extra purses to hold the coupons.

And along with the many purposes and shapes, there were a whole array of techniques used in making the bags: dyed with natural dyes or acid dyes or left with the natural colors, carded, combed or spun from the locks, felted, knitted, crocheted, woven, braided, embroidered, made in one piece or sewn together.

Three prizes were given out by public vote: the most creative, the most practical, and the most beautiful bag. Lynne Anguish won the most creative by a large margin for her felted tissue dispenser shaped like a cat's head (#12). The most practical bag had a tighter race. It was won by Eliza Brown for her crocheted bag (#17). The tightest race was for the most beautiful bag, which also was won by Eliza Brown, with just one vote more over the three runner-ups.

All that remains to say: Thanks to everyone for playing! I had a great time working on my own bag and I very much enjoyed seeing all the skill and creativity that went into everyone's work.






