#### Roc Day Contest

Spin any yarn in any ply using the 3 ounces of the 3 primary-colored rovings being given out, which you may blend with a drum carder, hand cards, a blending board, or other blending technique. You may create any gauge yarn. Use only the fiber from the provided rovings with no additions of other fibers or embellishments. It is not necessary to use all the fiber. Unblended fiber from the rovings may be used to create yarn for up to 50% of the mittens.

Using your yarn(s) knit and/or crochet a pair of mittens, adult or child sized, with or without fingers. The deadline for turning in your mittens to the judging table is 10:30 on Roc Day. There will be two judgings: one people's choice and one by judges.

This was interesting to organize as choosing the three primary colors from websites with appropriate rovings was done at a Zoom meeting. With input from those with good eyes for colors and the hope that the website colors were accurate, we have good primary colors for the contest. Packets for the contest were given out last guild meeting. The Fiber content is: Pacific Wool and Fiber 100% Merino Wool from Great Britain Red # 1836 Blue # 3023 Yellow # 1842







### **Contest Submission Instructions**

For virtual Roc Day, we will be judging by popular vote only, as it is difficult for our judges to give good feedback from photos. Please keep your items, as we are hoping to do a second round of the competition later in the year.

For the virtual judging, I will be compiling a photo album of everyone's projects, anonymously. This will be posted to our Facebook page and sent out to the members by email, along with a poll so you can vote for your favorites.

If you are competing, please submit three photos (as best you can, we understand that good cameras and models may not be readily available).

- 1. One close-up to show the details of the yarn, with a coin or something similar for scale.
- 2. One of both mittens flat, showing the front of one and back of the other.
- 3. One of the mittens modeled on you, family, a pet, stuffed with paper, or however works for you. Please try to avoid capturing your face or identifying features.

Please send pictures to me, <u>rachael.siems.skye@gmail.com</u>, by **12pm on January 8th.** I need plenty of time to compile this, so I can't guarantee I'll be able to include pictures submitted later. Additionally, if you've already finished please don't wait for the deadline; **send pictures well in advance**. Thank you!


