#### **Roc Day Contest**

The Roc Day contest is underway for January 2022! Thank you so much to Anne Furman and her helpers for choosing the contest and packing fiber. Pick up a kit at a meeting to join, or email Anne (<a href="mailto:ahfurman@yahoo.com">ahfurman@yahoo.com</a>) if you can't make it.

#### **Roc Day 2022 Spinning Challenge**

Spin the 2.5 ounces of Merino wool roving to create 2 singles. Spinning techniques are your choice — any gauge, any twist, or any ply. Ply the 2 singles together, incorporating the dyed kid mohair locks. These locks should not be carded or otherwise prepped; they should be plyed in. An example of one type of this plying is included in the packet. Use **only the fiber provided** with no dyeing or additions of any kind. It is not necessary to use all the fiber. It is necessary to use only the fiber provided.


The superfine merino roving is from Outback fibers in Colorado, color Hydrangea:

The kid mohair locks are from Diane Coon at Coon Hollow Farm in Hamilton, Montana.

Finishing the yarn to set the twist by steaming or washing is recommended. Loosely tying the yarn in 3 places is also suggested. There will be two judgings: one for proficiency, and one by people's choice.

The deadline for turning your yarn in is 10:30 AM on Roc Day.

I also have to share some finds from the collection of the Rockefeller Museum in East Jerusalem. Here are some whorls, spindles, and a sheep head statue. Wish I'd copied down details on the age of these, but it was probably well before the Common Era.

Well, it took me about 4 years to make this shawl. It's made of Silk Tussah, Merino, and Yak purchased from Susan Sarabasha of the Spinning Bunny in 2017. The wool was hand spun into a 4 ply yarn. I have named it the Meditation Shawl. I was hoping to present it at Roc Day, but it seems that life in the days of COVID had other plans. I am now on to making socks, hopefully.









## Angelika St. Laurent

#### A Fleece to Sweater Project

In 2019 Marie Bryant invited me and my children to visit her to watch her sheep getting sheared. Since I love sheep, fleeces, and any good opportunity for education of course I followed the invitation. The sheep got a haircut on a chilly Monday in March. And I drove home with the fleece of a young ewe called Twotone (I took the children back home, as wel). The fleece was a beautiful mix of white and gray wool, and big enough for two sweaters.



I dyed half of the fleece with Greener Shade Dyes. I was aiming for a turquoise yarn. But to give the yarn-color more depth (and because I wasn't entirely sure if I'd hit a pleasant hue dyeing everything at once), I dyed the wool in four colors, turquoise, green, blue, and orange, and carded the four colors together. The result was nicely heathered batts.













The wool was a dream to spin. I started spinning in 2020 on our last retreat. And a few months later, I had enough yarn to knit a sweater. As any spinner would, I stashed the yarn safely away in my yarn bin in the attic.










In May 2021, I started knitting. I followed a top down raglan pattern from Ann Budd's Handy Book of Top Down Sweaters, and used the cable patterns for the Arnhild Sweater in Viking Knits and Ancient Ornaments. Knitting took me a while. I prefer to knit top-down sweaters with my handspun yarn, it is easier to adjust the length, should I run short of yarn – and I don't particularly enjoy seaming. I finished just in time to put the finished and blocked sweater for my daughter under the Christmas tree.


