Trying to Spin a Bubble Crepe

Back in 2017, we invited Sarah Anderson, author of <u>The Spinner's Book of Yarn Design</u>, to teach us for weekend how to draft and ply. Among other things, she taught us how to spin bubble crepe. A yarn in which two thin plies wrap themselves in opposite direction around a thick central ply. The resulting yarn looks a bit like a string of pearls or bubbles.









Right after the workshop I decided I absolutely had to spin such a yarn and it only took a few years of maturing in my bucket list, before I got around to it. I started out spinning a thick colored single in z-direction from Romney locks, I combed and dyed for it. Realizing my single wasn't remotely as thick as I wanted it, I chain plied it (s). The next step was to spin a thin single in the same direction as the chain ply (s). I choose a very light moorit fleece I had sitting around, and simply flicked the locks open before spinning. I had to ply with twice the amount of twist than I'd have to achieve a balanced yarn, creating a very tightly overplied yarn (I went a bit overboard in that step and sometimes added more than the necessary twist unfortunately.)

The last two steps were now to spin another thin single in the same direction as my overplied yarn (z). Finally, I had to ply the single and the overplied yarn again in the opposite direction, adding just the amount of twist necessary for the two thin plies to cross each other evenly and the thick ply to 'pop'. Sarah Anderson warned us during her class that it is easy to over ply at this step, so I did it on the hand spindle for more control.

All in all, I'm quite happy with my result. Even though, in a few stretches, I overdid and as a result the thick colored center didn't pop into a nice bubble, but stayed kind of crinkly.


