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# **Message from the President**

Dear Fellow Spinners,

Spring is here, well almost. At least it is lurking around the corner. I'm looking forward to starting my garden and finishing my winter-themed spinning projects. But winter might not be quite as much done, yet, as I hope. And right now, it looks in the weather forecast that the date of out our next meeting on Saturday, March 12th, might be the date we'll receive a few inches of snow as parting gift of the outgoing season. We plan to meet in person on Saturday, March 12th, from 11am-3pm, in the All Saints Parish Hall (347 Ridge Road, Lansing). The meeting will be masked and socially distanced.

During our next meeting we have a couple of things to discuss: Our post-poned Roc Day is coming up on May 14th. #### Wool and Mohair Skirting Workshop

Join Cornell Cooperative Extension of Cortland County (CCE Cortland) and Springside Farm for a Wool & Mohair Skirting Workshop on Saturday April 23rd from 9:00 – 11:30 am at Springside Farm in Fabius NY. This 2 1/2-hour workshop will include both a presentation and a hands-on portion where attendees will have the opportunity to learn and practice skirting fleece for various markets. As shearing season, for many, comes to an end the question remains what to do with all that wool? No matter the end market skirting is a step that most every wool producer needs to perform but many feel overwhelmed by the task. This workshop is designed to help attendees understand what skirting is, to what extent they need to skirt, and have the opportunity to put their knowledge to practice.

During the presentation, Dana Havas of CCE Cortland will review the difference between skirting and classing (why, when, and how), the various market channels and how they relate to skirting, what you should have on hand to make skirting efficient and effective for your end goals/product.

After a short break (snacks provided) Pauli Drexler, shepherd and owner of Springside Farm, will lead the hands-on portion where attendees will get to watch, learn, and practice skirting fleeces. Pauli will review the various steps, point out the relationship between skirting and the market channel, and then invite attendees to put their hands to it and practice skirting themselves (attendees are encouraged to bring fleeces and/or skirting tables, but this is not necessary as there will be plenty of fleeces to work with from Pauli's flock).





Handouts will be made available for all attendees.

Register early to attendee – only 20 spaces are available and registration closes on Monday April 18th!







