



Recipes

Our April potluck had some amazing reipes! Here are a few.

Orange Almond Flourless Cake

By Jean Currie

2 medium oranges

6 eggs

265 g granulated sugar, sifted

250 g almond meal (I used almond flour - same thing??), sifted

1 tsp baking powder

1 tsp vanilla extract

sliced almonds for sprinkling on top

powdered sugar to dust on top

- 1. Simmer the oranges in enough water to cover for 2 hours, drain the pot and let them cool.
- 2. Preheat oven to 350 F. Grease 10' springform pan & I put a piece of parchment paper in the bottom as well.
- 3. Carve out the stem/stalk of the oranges. Cut up the oranges (everything skin, membranes and seeds) into chunks and puree in food processor do until you see only tiny specks of skin
- 4. Whisk sugar and eggs I actually beat them until the sugar was well combined with the eggs. Whisk/beat in vanilla. Add the orange puree.
- 5. Add the almond meal and BP and mix till well combined.
- 6. Pour into the pan, put almonds on top.
- 7. Bake approximately 1 hour and 10 min. Check at 1 hour. Mine was done in less than an hour and got a little burned on the edges.
- 8. Check for readiness with a toothpick you know the drill!
- 9. Let rest 10 minutes and then take the pan off.
- 10. When cool, dust with powdered sugar.









Marie Bryhan's nutmeg cake

2C flour

2C brown sugar

1/2 C butter

Mix to make crumbs, and spread half the mixture in greased pan.

To the remaining flour/sugar/butter mix, add:

1C sour cream

1 egg

1tsp baking soda

1tsp grated nutmeg (I just grind up a whole one)

Pour this on top of the crumbs, top with nutmeats and bake at 350F for about one hour.


