Fiber artist Sheila Hicks will be highlighted with inspirational videos, slides, and a lively discussion. Please join the Mid Atlantic and beyond audience to enjoy this premiere event!

Sheila Hicks was born in Hastings, Nebraska and received her BFA and MFA degrees from Yale University where she studied with Bauhaus instructor Joseph Albers. She received a Fulbright scholarship in 1957-58 to paint in Chile. While in South America she developed her interest in working with fibers. After founding workshops in Mexico, Chile, and South Africa, and working in Morocco and India, she now divides her time between her Paris studio and New York. "Textile is a universal language. In all of the cultures of the world, textile is a crucial and essential component," Hicks has said. Captivated by structure, form, and color, she has looked to weaving cultures across the globe to shape her work.
